

CPD Program-level requirement:

Addressing Health Inequities

Australian doctors must dedicate part of their annual CPD time to Addressing Health Inequities. This requires completing at least one relevant CPD activity each year that addresses this requirement and aligns with their specific scope of practice.

All program-level CPD requirements are aligned to the Australian Medical Council's **Good medical practice: a code of conduct for doctors in Australia** (the code). It is suggested to start there when starting to plan CPD activities that are aligned with these requirements.

The code states that: "Good medical practice involves using your expertise and influence to identify and address healthcare inequity and protect and advance the health and wellbeing of individual patients, communities and populations".

Addressing Health Inequity, as stated by (the code) requires:

- using expertise and influence to identify healthcare inequity.
- using expertise and influence to address healthcare inequity.
- protect and advance the health and wellbeing of individual patients, communities and populations.
