# Module 1 - Rheumatology and Immunology

Rheumatology is the diagnosing, treating and managing diseases of the joints, muscles and bones. This includes:

- arthritis where joints are painful, swollen and stiff
- other musculoskeletal conditions which affect bones, muscles, tendons, ligaments as well as joints
- autoimmune diseases where the musculoskeletal system and other body parts, including eyes, skin, internal organs and the nervous system, can be inflamed.

Immunology is the treatment of health issues brought on by immune system problems. Also known as allergists, immunologists are doctors who diagnose, treat, and work to prevent immune system disorders.
